Introduction

Our objective for Cheder education in Years 5 & 6 is to build on the students' knowledge of Judaism, providing them with a better understanding of the values, festivals and stories that shape our Jewish identity. The curriculum is based on age-appropriate books, short videos and will give the children an opportunity to express their creativity.





Term Overview

Classes will be held on Saturday morning during term time. In general, the morning will start with a short cheder assembly at 10am in the Osorio Hall - parents are warmly invited to attend alongside their children. The Jewish Studies lesson will run from 10:15 - 11am. This will be followed by an optional introduction to Hebrew class from 11:15 - noon. Unless older siblings are also enrolled in the cheder, we ask that parents stay in or around the synagogue during class time until we can confirm that the children have fully settled in.
